# 5 STEPS TO AN EMERGENCY PLAN FOR YOUR PETS

Thinking about what you would do if you suddenly had to go to the Emergency Room or have some other emergency? Here are 5 steps to being ready to provide for your pets in an emergency, whether they are cared for at home or if they need to be transported to safety.

1. Identify Caregivers for your pets. (Be sure to ask them!)
2. Document your Caregivers in your File of Life Packets with the Emergency Alert Card for Pets.
3. Document pet medications and keep the list and the meds in one place.
4. Keep a container ready with an emergency kit supply checklist stored in the container.
5. Have a crate for transport & crate train your pets in case travel is required.

## COVID-19 - YOU AND YOUR PETS



### Can your pet transmit the virus to you?

The AVMA (American Veterinary Medical Association) says that it appears there's little-to-no risk of pets transmitting the COVID-19 virus to their human owners.

"Transmission via touching a contaminated surface or object (i.e., a fomite) and then touching the mouth, nose, or possibly eyes is also possible, but appears to be a secondary route. Smooth (non-porous) surfaces (e.g., countertops, door knobs) transmit viruses better than porous materials (e.g., paper money, pet fur). **At this time, there is no evidence that the virus that causes COVID-19 can spread to people from the skin or fur of pets.**"

## Can you transmit the virus to your pet?

Recently, a tiger at the Bronx Zoo tested positive for SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19 in humans, however a wild cat is not the same as domestic cat and it is not conclusive that our pets can catch the virus from us. However, out of caution, the CDC (Center for Disease Control) and AVMA recommend that sick humans stay away from their animal companions. If you are sick or showing symptoms and you have to take care of your pet, the CDC recommends avoiding snuggles or touching your pet, and washing your hands thoroughly before and after feeding. It's always a good idea to wash your hands before and after interacting with animals; ensure your pet is kept well groomed; and regularly clean your pet's food and water bowls, bedding material, and toys."
